

1 – We don't know what course the pandemic will take in the future but we do know that taking care of our hearts right now is more important than ever.

2 - One of the most revered works in English literature, *Great Expectations*, traces the coming of age of a young orphan, Pip, from a boy of shallow aspirations into a man of maturity.

3 - Since it opened in 1959, the Guggenheim's Frank Lloyd Wright building has charmed many filmmakers with its spiraling ramps, and spectacular lines.

4 - Members of the film and television community have chosen to feature Guggenheim Museum in more than 25 productions over the years.

5 - The Musée du Louvre has decided to temporarily transfer the Mona Lisa to the Galerie Médicis. The painting will remain there from July 17 until work in the Salle des États is completed at the beginning of October 2019

6 - The General Court is made up of two judges from each Member State. Their term of office is six years, and is renewable. They appoint their President, for a period of three years, from amongst themselves.

7 - The General Court has its own Rules of Procedure. In principle, the proceedings include a written phase and an oral phase.

8 - The main points of the action are published in a notice, in all official languages, in the Official Journal of the European Union.

9 - The world still lacks a proven coronavirus vaccine, but that has not stopped Chinese officials from trying to inoculate tens of thousands, if not hundreds of thousands, of people outside the traditional testing process.

10 - The 2020 presidential election marks the 60th anniversary of the landmark televised Kennedy-Nixon debates, a series of events that have shaped national politics ever since.

11 - The number of people who might remain out of office is staggering: one study found that more than a third of American jobs could be done entirely from home.

12 - By March 23, restrictions on all nonessential movement throughout the country were enacted, officially commencing a full lockdown in Greece.

13 - The United Kingdom left the European Union on 31 January 2020 at midnight, when the withdrawal agreement entered into force.

14 - As the UK has become a third country, negotiations on the future partnership between the EU and the UK could start. The first round of the negotiations took place in Brussels on 2 March 2020.

15 - The European Council is the EU institution that defines the general political direction and priorities of the European Union. It consists of the heads of state or government of the member states, together with its President and the President of the Commission.

16 - The International Monetary Fund (IMF) is an organization of 189 countries, working to foster global monetary cooperation, secure financial stability, facilitate international trade, promote high employment and sustainable economic growth, and reduce poverty around the world.

17 - Climate change presents a major threat to long-term growth and prosperity, and it has a direct impact on the economic wellbeing of all countries.

18 - The 77th Venice International Film Festival is organised by La Biennale di Venezia and directed by Alberto Barbera. It took place at Venice Lido from 2 - 12 September 2020.

19 - Pets are allowed to travel across national boundaries only if they have more than three months of age, except where otherwise provided for by the competent Authority.

20 - Schengen agreement put an end to border controls, allowing the free circulation of people and enhancing domestic market development.

21 - The traveller's customs Charter is a simple and easy-to-use tool intended to inform as to main customs provisions as well as a useful help for those who need to prepare the necessary documentation in advance.

22 - The Metropolitan City of Milan has promoted the establishment of a network of large European urban and metropolitan areas (financed with European funds) with which it is strategically working for the development of the European Urban Agenda.
