
Speaker Biographies for METREX Lisbon e.Conference – 1 July 2020



DR. NICOLA SCHELLING, is elected Regional Director of the Stuttgart Region and President of METREX since 2014. Before taking her current office, she was Head of the Representation of the State of Baden-Württemberg to the EU in Brussels. Prior to that, she managed the Department of Crossborder and Interregional Cooperation at the State Ministry of Baden-Württemberg and worked as a National Expert at the European Commission in Brussels. Dr. Nicola Schelling studied Law in Marburg and Paris and started her career as a judge.



FERNANDO MEDINA, President of Lisbon Metropolitan Area and Mayor of Lisbon. Has a Degree in Economics by the Faculty of Economics of the University of Porto and a Master's Degree in Economic Sociology by the School of Economics and Management from de University of Lisbon. He was Secretary of State for Industry and Development from 2009 to 2011, and Secretary of State for Employment and Vocational Training from 2005 to 2009. From 2011 to 2013 he was a member of the Portuguese Parliament, serving namely in the Budget and Finance Commission. He also was Adviser to the Chairman of the Portuguese Investment Agency, Adviser to the Prime Minister on Education, Science and Technology, Member of the Ministry of **Education Working Group of the Portuguese** Presidency of the European Union.



CARLOS HUMBERTO DE CARVALHO, First Metropolitan Secretary of the Executive Committee of the Lisbon Metropolitan Area since 2017, did his secondary studies at the Commercial and Industrial School. He attended the General Accounting Course at the Commercial Institute of Lisbon. He was elected deputy at the Barreiro Municipal Assembly from 1993 to 2005. He assumed the presidency of the Barreiro City Council, on October 27, 2005, where he remained until 22 October 2017. He was part of the Intermunicipal Assembly of the Association of Municipalities of the Setúbal Region and the Intermunicipal Water Association of the Setúbal Peninsula, the Municipal Health Observatory, the Municipal Water Observatory, the Municipal Youth Council, the Municipal Security Council, Local Council of Social Action of Barreiro, Municipal Council of Associativism, Municipal Council of Education, Municipal Council for Urban Rehabilitation, Local Council of Mobility, Local Council on Climate Change. He was President of the Regional Economics Commission, from 2006 to 2009, was a member of the General Council of the Metropolitan Transport Authority of Lisbon, was an effective member of the Strategic Advisory Committee of POR Lisboa.



FILIPE FERREIRA, MA in Economics and Public Policies form ISCTE- Universitary Institute of Lisbon. Has worked in several municipalities from Lisbon Metropolitan Area (LMA) in Social Cohesion, International Relations and EU projects.

Since 2014 is working at LMA as Metropolitan Secretary and its main areas of interest are territorial planning, EU funding, training, economic development and public procurement. He is now co-coordinating the LMA 2030 Regional Strategy and is LMA focal point regarding ESPON METRO consortium.





SÉRGIO BARROSO, Geographer and Urbanist, Ms in Regional and Urban Planning, Director of the Center for Studies and Regional and Urban Development (CEDRU), since 2001, and specialist in the areas of spatial planning and climate change adaptation, urban and strategic planning and evaluation of public policies.

Was the coordinator of the Climate Change Adaptation Plan of the Metropolitan Area of Lisbon and the coordinator of several other inter-municipal and municipal plans of adaptation, in the last five years. Was, also, the coordinator of the studies for creating the Municipalities Network to Climate Change Local Adaptation.

Was a consultant of the Regional Spatial Plan of the Metropolitan Area of Lisbon, and the coordinator of coastal management programs and spatial plans of reservoirs and lagoons.

FREDERICO METELO, Senior Technician at the Lisbon Metropolitan Area. Degree in Geography and Regional Development by the Lusophone University of Humanities and Technologies of Lisbon. Postgraduate in Sustainable Cities from the Faculty of Science and Technology (FCT), Universidade Nova de Lisboa.

Experience and technical skills in the areas of geography, climate change, regional and urban planning and geographic information systems. He has more than 16 years of professional experience in the development of strategic planning projects, land use planning, rural and urban development, urban and environmental regeneration and requalification, adaptation to climate change and technical and operational management of geographic information systems. national and international level

As collaborated in the implementation of the training and technical training component of the ClimAdaPT.Local project (integrated in the AdaPT Program - Adapting Portugal to Climate Change), under which he was responsible for the design and production of training facilities and the organization, implementation and

He integrated the technical teams, in the area of training, communication and awareness, of the CEDRU / IGOT-UL / WE CONSULTANTS consortium responsible for the elaboration of the 'Intermunicipal Plan for Adaptation to Climate Change of Viseu Dão Lafões', of the 'Intermunicipal Plan for Adaptation to Changes' Climate of the Central Alentejo ', the' Intermunicipal Plan for Adaptation to Climate Change in the West 'and the' Municipal Plan for Climate Action in Loulé ', also technically supporting the team of experts in the area of' agriculture and forests' referring to the same Plans.

More recently, he coordinated the training and communication component of the 'Metropolitan Plan for Adaptation to Climate Change in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area'; the Municipal Plans for Adaptation to Climate Change in the municipalities of Loures and Odivelas; the 'actions to publicize and disseminate the geographic information project to support adaptation to climate change in the Alentejo Central (SIG-GO Project)'; and 'communication and awareness actions on climate change with the school community of Viseu Dão Lafões'.

Currently he is part of the technical team of the Metropolitan Area of Lisbon, being responsible for the 'implementation of the PMAAC-AML information management, monitoring and follow-up system'.







puarte Mata, Landscape Architect since 2000 from Lisbon University, he has worked for years on several landscape plans and as project designer. At Lisbon Municipality since 2007, he's directly related with public policy for green infrastructure including NBS (nature based solutions) for climate adaptation. In addition to the role as head of cabinet of the Deputy Mayor for Environment, Green Infrastructure, Climate and Energy since 2015, he's connected to the European Green Capital Award as well as with LIFE LUNGS for climate adaptation in green infrastructure and the recently approved CONEXUS H2020 project.

SILVIA WEIDEBACHER, is Landscape Architect and Senior Landscape Planner in the planning department of Verband Stuttgart Region. Her key responsibilities are green infrastructure planning on regional level and strategic planning related to adaption to climate change, including the management of European and national funding projects.

MAARIA PARRY, is a Climate Specialist at Helsinki Region Environmental Services (HSY). This year she is temporarily working as the Head of the Climate Change Unit, in which position she is leading a team of ten professionals advancing climate change mitigation and adaptation and circular economy in the region. Her duties include the coordination of a new urban sustainability programme for the Helsinki metropolitan region. The focus of her work at HSY is in climate change adaptation, which she finds an intriguing challenge, as it requires understanding of both natural hazards and social vulnerability. Parry holds M.Sc. in Environmental Sciences and M.A. in Human Geography.



IGNACIO DE LA PUERTA, Master in Architecture from the School of Architecture of Madrid in the specialty of Building (1983), is a "Graduate in Urban Law", specialist in "Building, Renovation and Sustainable Urban Planning" as well as "Civil and Commercial Mediator", with extensive experience in strategic planning and quality processes.

Since 1983 he has been holding the position of CEO of IP Arquitectos, in which both Projects and Construction Management and Renovation Works have been developed, as well as Urban Planning, an activity that he has maintained until his appointment (January 2017) as General Director for Territorial Planning, Urbanism and Urban Regeneration in the Basque Government.
